Course Description				
<p>This course will introduce officers to basic SWAT tactics. Officers will be instructed on SWAT planning and response to critical incidents, the application of SWAT in high risk warrant execution, barricaded subject and hostage incidents. Officers will be instructed on dynamic and stealth entries, officer deployment and team movements. Training will be one day in the classroom, 3 days in the field. The class will also include a review of legal issues of Illinois Compiled Statute regarding Peace Officers Use of Force in Making Arrest. The practical exercise part of this training will involve use of force scenario based training exercises. (ILETSB "Use of Force" brochure will be provided to all participants)</p>

<p>Upon completion of this training officers will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Perform perimeter and command post operations • Properly plan, execute and report on SWAT operations • Manage barricaded subject situations • Have an understanding of hostage rescue issues • Build/room entry and clearing techniques • Perform various shooting techniques <i>(positions, as a team member, off hand, close-in, reloading, immediate action drills, shield shooting)</i> • Understand proper and necessary equipment for the tasks to be performed in SWAT type operations • Understand Distraction Devices, Chemical Weapon use, Sniper, Robot, Masks and Mirrors • Vehicle assaults • Understand and perform tactical communications • Prepare proper Planning and After-Action Reports. • Perform vehicle loading/movement/placement
