### Course Description

This class will include a basic review of search and seizure law, including constitutional and statutory principals and will cover basic search warrant exceptions. This class will primarily focus on the preparation, drafting and execution of search warrants. Burdens, specifically requirements and legitimate expanding the target of a particular search. There will be a review of statutory and constitutional requirements for the granting of search warrants. A segment of this training will be devoted to the proper return of a search warrant and statutory requirements for proper return to the court. Emerging trends in the law, as it relates to digital evidence, including social media, cloud based storage, mobile communication and other business records will be covered. The preparation of search warrants for data and digital records will be discussed. There will be discussion on defending search warrants to include the importance of careful drafting of the search warrant. There will be a block of instruction covering drafting and executing Eavesdropping Petitions and Orders (Overhears).

### Course Objectives

#### Officers will gain an understanding of:

- The burden required for drafting search warrant complaints and what documents will be needed.
- The limitations on searches and legitimate ways to expand a proper search.
- The interplay of search warrant exceptions during the execution of a search.
- The emerging trend of search warrants applied to digital evidence.
- The importance of knowing how a search warrant can be attacked and what information can be considered during a future attack.
- Basic Eavesdropping law, requirements and documents needed for overhear orders.

#### Focused Topics:

- Legal principals, both statutory and constitutional.
- Tips and examples of drafting documents.
- Obtaining Digital Evidence via search warrants, including social media, cloud based storage, cell phone data, etc.
- Newest trends surrounding Digital Evidence.

### Instructor

Jackson County Assistant States Attorney, **Casey Bloodworth**, will be the instructor for this class. Mr. Bloodworth holds a BA Degree in Administration of Justice from Southern Illinois University School and is a graduate of the S.I.U. School of Law.
