Course Description

The rapid deployment/active shooter training program is designed to equip patrol officers with the skills to respond to and deal with a patently unsafe “Active Threat” situation as safely as possible.

Course Objectives

Participants will be trained in techniques to hone their skills and build their confidence by emphasizing:

- Critical thinking to assess and decide the correct response to an active shooter/threat.
- Proper gear for the task at hand
- Team types, movements and coordination
- Room entry and dominance
- Mental conditioning for what is found at the scene of an active shooter
- Supervisor’s or first responding officer’s responsibilities and goals
- Weapons handling and discipline
- Special considerations when encountering explosives or weapons of mass destruction
- Officer/citizen victim rescue
- Discussion of recent relevant events and the challenges they presented
- Review of use of force statutes and relevant case law*
- Field first aid for bleeding control associated with gunshots and tourniquet usage

**Participants will be provided with the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board “Use of Force” brochure and the contents of that brochure will be discussed during the Use of Force lecture portion of the class.*

Instructor

Mobile Team Unit 15 Field Assistant Kelley Hulseley will be the primary instructor for this class. During his career with the Illinois State Police Kelley was a member of their Tactical Response Team, was trained as a Rapid Deployment Instructor and gained extensive experience as a Police Firearms Instructor.

Other Information

Officers should wear utility type clothing (BDU or Tactical Uniform) and ballistic vest. Safety glasses and protective gloves should be worn as the class will involve scenario based, Force on Force exercises utilizing *Air Soft* type training weapons. Officers should bring full duty gear belt although **no live weapons; firearms, TASER, blades, chemical aerosols, etc. will be allowed in the training area.**
