### Course Description

This 1-day street level course will deliver the skills to provide life-saving self-aid/buddy-aid (SA/BA) in the event of serious injury. What differentiates this training from standard first-aid is the focus on providing proven tactical medical concepts in a hostile environment. The morning session will consist of lecture and practical instruction in the core concepts SA/BA; airway/breathing, bleeding control, shock assessment, high-threat evacuation. The afternoon will be hands-on use of the contents of the Individual First Aid Kit allowing each officer to become familiar with the medical equipment and evacuation process.
