Course Description

This class will cover the use of less-lethal, 12-gauge impact projectiles. Training will cover the proper use of the munitions. In addition to classroom instruction, there will be live fire range exercise for proper, safe handling and shot placement. The classroom portion will give instruction and visual aids from past cases in which officers have deployed 12-gauge less lethal munitions to resolve situations. After completion of the classroom portion all students will have a written exam to show their understanding of the topics. Officers will then complete a live fire exercise with a minimum of 5 impact munitions fired per student. They will also review of use of force and the use of force continuum and case law as it applies to these munitions

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this class students will be able to:

- Choose suggested "rules of engagement" for the use and deployment of impact projectiles
- Choose the design and performance characteristics of the 12-gauge impact round
- Describe here such weapons are generally found on the use of force model
- Describe the single most critical issue involved in preventing impact projectile deaths
- Properly select from a list, the method in which suspects will be handled after impact projectile deployment
- Properly demonstrate the ability to make appropriate decisions related to "shoot-don't shoot" with impact projectiles, and in a "shoot" scenario, choose the appropriate aiming point based on the facts presented
- Demonstrate the ability to safely load, unload, and accurately deliver impact projectiles from a 12-gauge smooth bore pump shotgun
- Understand the limitations of the 12-gauge impact munitions on individuals due to other mental or physical issues such as self-mutilation or attempted suicide

Equipment Needs

Participants must supply a Department-issued 12-gauge smooth bore pump shotgun (cylinder bore, no choke), eye and ear protection, a minimum of 5 rounds of 12-gauge impact munitions, and note-taking materials.

Instructor

Williamson County Sheriff's Deputy Chris Fozzard will be the instructor for this class. Chris has been a law enforcement officer for over 10 years. Chris is a Police Firearms Instructor and long-time trainer for MTU 15 and ILEAS. Chris has trained in impact projectiles, chemical munitions & noise/flash diversionary devices with Watch House International.
