Course Description

The Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) of 2003 is a Federal law established to address the elimination and prevention of sexual assault and rape in correctional systems. PREA applies to all federal, state and local prisons, jails, lockups, private facilities, and community settings such as residential facilities, and it mandates specific training based on different categories of personnel.

This 4-hour program has been designed for the purpose of addressing the issue of training adjunct personnel, such as medical and mental health professionals, volunteers, clergy, other facility personnel to comply with PREA regulations in the capacity that they interact with inmates. Boundaries and mandated responses will be outlined and explained to each participant depending on their role or profession.

Course Objectives

This training will include, but not be limited to, the following learning objectives:

- ✓ To understand PREA standards relevant to their position
- ✓ To detect & assess the signs of sexual abuse & harassment
- ✓ To understand how trauma effects confined inmates
- ✓ To understand the procedure for reporting infractions to the PREA standards
- ✓ To understand effective & professional interactive responses to inmates
- ✓ To understand the appropriate procedures for forensic evidence preservation
