Course Description

This program examines numerous ways each Department Officer/Deputy can enlarge their agency's communication base in their communities towards building and increasing public trust. The course examines the inside-out approach for consistent character-driven policing through five outreach tiers to maximize Officer contacts with residents and the business owners.

It will identify numerous ways Officers meet the public (casual, non-criminal, and criminal circumstances). It will also discuss how to make positive in-roads with enclave cultural groups, subject to misperceptions, fear, and bias against the police. The course offers concrete ways Officers can/should build support for their agency and mission, as well as discussing how unethical Officers can negatively damage an agency's credibility.

Course Objectives

Participants will discuss:

- 1. The rational basis for connecting/investing in the public.
- 2. Potential tangible gains for connecting/investing with a diverse public.
- 3. Awareness of resident demographics, cultural enclaves, and communication patterns.
- 4. The Ethical Hierarchy and how each level impacts community relationships.
- 5. Tiers of public contact/programs towards ethical investment strategies
- 6. The significance of policing the police within your agency.

Jan Mirikitani teaches leadership principles for organizational communication competency with realistic applications. She has worked with federal, state, county, and municipal governments (primarily law enforcement) as well as corporations and school districts. Jan has been a continuing education trainer for the St. Louis County & Municipal Police Academy for nearly 30 years.
