### Course Description

The Exterior response to an Active Shooter Event will prepare first responders for an open-air active shooter encounter. First responders will be trained in equipment selection, vehicle ambushes, medical emergencies, vehicle and dismounted officer/citizen down rescue, individual and team movement techniques, and emergency vehicle crisis response. Students will be taught the Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training (ALERT) program.

### Course Objectives

- ✓ Recognize the difference between situations that require responders to close distance or contain a suspect. Participants will identify the concepts and principles of appropriate actions in situations that may include an exterior active shooter, wooded barricade situations, or terrorist attacks occurring in open terrain
- ✓ Recognize the need for law enforcement medical training, identify the phases of care within the Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) model, and appropriate life-saving interventions within each phase
- ✓ Participants will also demonstrate techniques to extract victims from the point of wounding to a higher level of medical care
- ✓ Use tactical considerations and respond appropriately to an injured officer/ citizen with a vehicle
- ✓ Demonstrate proper techniques of moving in the low crawl, high crawl, and 3-5 second rush
- ✓ Demonstrate proper techniques of team formations and crossing danger areas
- ✓ Demonstrate proper actions in both near and far contact engagements
- ✓ Use tactical considerations and respond appropriately to an injured officer/citizen without the aid of a vehicle
- ✓ Use tactical considerations to evaluate and respond appropriately to a hostage or barricaded subject situation in a vehicle
- ✓ Use tactical considerations to evaluate the situation and respond appropriately to an ambush while in their vehicle and demonstrate techniques used to fight from a vehicle
- ✓ Demonstrate the ability to use tactical considerations to evaluate

**Recommended Equipment:** Good attitude, open mind, pen and paper, duty gear, clothing conducive for crawling around on the ground, water and or hydration system, body armor, long gun (if issued), and inclement weather gear (majority of course is outside regardless of weather conditions)
