Course Description

The “*Patrol Rifle*” has been adopted by many law enforcement agencies today as their primary long gun for general patrol applications. Advantages of the *Patrol Rifle* include superior ballistic performance, increased effective range, and greater accuracy. Proper training and proficiency measurement with the *Patrol Rifle*, prior to its duty deployment, is essential. This *basic* course is intended to prepare officers to deploy the *Patrol Rifle* in the “general patrol” environment. This is not a “*Precision Rifle*” or “*Special Weapons and Tactics*” course. Students must pass both a written and practical (*qualification*) test to successfully complete this *State Certified* course.

- Semi or Full automatic rifle, with detachable box magazine, chambered in .223 Rem. or 5.56 mm
- Three 20 or 30 round magazines
- 400 rounds of factory new brass cased ammunition (***steel casings prohibited***)
- Sight adjustment tool
- Two-point sling / one-point sling
- Shooting glasses & hearing protection
- Waterproof ground cover/pad
- Bi-pod or other support (*for zeroing exercises*)
- Rifle cleaning kit
