Course Description

Situations of high stress in which the 'fight-or-flight response' is initiated can impact an officer's perceptions, misperceptions, and decision-making abilities. Using research-based, scientifically validated information coupled with case studies of contemporary real-world threats, critical incidents, and experiences, we explore the specific effects of the body's fight-or-flight response, the effects of that response on our ability to perform, and how the limitations of human observation and perception can negatively impact our readiness and response.

Who Should Attend:

Line officers, trainers, supervisors, public information officers, and administrators. This material is critical for supervisors and administrators as it helps shape realistic expectations about officer performance in high-risk and high-liability situations, as well as training requirements for improving performance during high-risk events.
