Course Description

Illinois 95th General Assembly Resolution 0051 requires *Manufacturer's* Certification on Elector-Muscular Disruption Technology (EMDT) Employed by Illinois Law Enforcement and Correctional Officers. TASER International requires that users of the TASER Conducted Electrical Weapon (CEW) device take a certification course prior to carrying the TASER. That certification expires one year from the date of issue.

This 4-hour class is for the re-certification of those officers who have previously received the full 8-hour TASER Conducted Electrical Weapon Certification class. This re-certification will involve a review of TASER technology and the proper and safe methods for deployment of the TASER EMD device. "Failure Drills" will be practiced and a written examination will be given, as a part of this re-certification process.

Officers attending this class must have been certified or re-certified within the last calendar year.

Course Objectives

- ✓ Understand how the TASER overrides & controls the central nervous system of a combative subject
- ✓ Know proper aiming & deployment of the TASER CEW
- ✓ Reload in a safe & proper manner
- ✓ Recognize when the TASER is armed & ready to deploy
- ✓ Know how to install batteries
- ✓ Proper utilization of the laser sight
- ✓ Understand probe placement ballistics
- ✓ Demonstrate proper & accurate deployment of TASER cartridges in target
- ✓ Constitutional issues & case law on Use-of-Force & "Intermediate Weapons"

Instructor

MTU 15 Training Assistant Kelley Hulsey is certified by AXON (*formerly TASER International*) as a TASER CEW Device Instructor. Kelley is retired from the Illinois State Police with 30 years of law enforcement experience. He served as the primary range instructor for ISP District 12 for the last decade of his career and certified as a Patrol Rifle Instructor since 2005, instructing at the ISP Academy, the Federal Bureau of Prisons Greenville facility, as well as in District 12. Additionally, Kelley is a ISP-certified Active Shooter Trainer and AR 15 and Glock armorer.
