Course Description

This entry-level crime scene processing class will provide patrol officers or detectives with an overview of the responsibilities involved with crime scenes and with basic knowledge of crime scene processing and physical evidence awareness. This 3-day, hands-on training is designed to develop confidence in evaluating crime scenes with a special emphasis on knowing how to secure a scene and who to call. Attendees will learn to recognize significant types of physical evidence and develop their skill levels in dealing with different types of crime scenes. The training will include classroom lecture, demonstration of differing techniques and specialties, and mock crime scene exercises in which the attendees will process the scene(s). Crime scene photography will also be included.
