<p>The “Patrol Rifle” has been adopted by many law enforcement agencies today as their primary long gun for general patrol applications. Advantages of the <i>Patrol Rifle</i> include superior ballistic performance, increased effective range, and greater accuracy. Proper training and proficiency measurement with the <i>Patrol Rifle</i>, prior to its duty deployment, is essential. This <i>basic</i> course is intended to prepare officers to deploy the <i>Patrol Rifle</i> in the “general patrol” environment. This is <u>not</u> a “<i>Precision Rifle</i>” or “<i>Special Weapons and Tactics</i>” course. Students must pass both a written and practical (<i>qualification</i>) test to successfully complete this <i>State Certified</i> course.</p>
