<p>This course will be taught using K9 Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (K9 TECC) guidelines. Instruction will be given on canine anatomy, proper treatment of various illnesses and injuries, and evacuation and transport of the ill or injured canine. Lecture, as well as demonstrations will be used to facilitate learning throughout this class. The class is intended for canine handlers, as well as any officer who wishes to learn these valuable skills in case of a canine medical emergency.</p>
