Course Description

This train-the-trainer course is designed to develop tactical firearms instructors. Students will be taught classroom instructional methods, how to effectively teach Patrol Rifle operator skills relevant to the dynamic police operational environment, and how to develop practical range training relevant to their agency's needs.

This is an interactive course where students actively participate in the learning environment created by experienced firearms instructors. Students in the course will be expected to conduct “teach-backs” of learned and designed material to instructors and fellow instructor candidates, as well as develop their own lesson plan and course of fire. Students must successfully pass practical and written exams to receive an Instructor Certificate.

Students registering for this course must have successfully completed a Firearms Instructor Course and a Basic Patrol Rifle course approved by the ILETSB. This course is not a beginner's course and involves advanced training that requires students to have the basic knowledge from the two required courses.

Attendees must bring AR-15 style rifle with 500 rounds of ammunition and duty handgun with 150 rounds of ammunition.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this class students will be able to:

- ✓ Identify and abide by, and cause others to abide by, Firearms and Range Safety Rules
- ✓ Instruct students in the proper loading, unloading, and operation of the Patrol Rifle
- ✓ Instruct students in Patrol Rifle shooting fundamentals and marksmanship
- ✓ Identify and provide remedy to shooters who exhibit difficulty with basic marksmanship skills
- ✓ Instruct students in proper Rifle inspection and maintenance
- ✓ Instruct students in basic knowledge, nomenclature, and selection of ammunition
- ✓ Instruct students in the tactical use of the Rifle in a LE field environment
- ✓ Safely operate the police firing range as a range master
- ✓ Develop and safely and effectively deliver dynamic courses of live-fire, incorporating proper police tactics
- ✓ Properly prepare a lesson plan for classroom presentations
- ✓ Develop and effectively deliver classroom presentations
- ✓ Describe and effectively convey all legal aspects of (IL) Peace Officer's Use of Force in Making Arrest (720 ILCS 5/7-5).
- ✓ Clearly understand and convey potential issues for firearms instructors regarding failure to train liabilities
