Other Information

A <u>Form E, "Notice of Appointment"</u>, must be on file with the State Training Board in Springfield prior to enrollment in this class. An MTU 15 <u>Course Enrollment Form</u> and a copy of the officer's "Form E" <u>must</u> be received by MTU 15 for enrollment in this class no later than one week prior to the start of the class.

All weapons and ammunition will be inspected on the first day of this class. If significant malfunctions occur, which the Lead Instructor determines are caused by a faulty weapon or ammunition, the student will be required to replace the defective gun, or ammunition, before continuing with the class. It is <u>strongly</u> recommended that officers train and qualify with the handgun that they will carry on duty.
