Course Description

This class will include a complete analysis of the current Freedom of Information statute with a detailed discussion of the terms and definitions listed in the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). The Illinois Attorney General's guide to the application of the Freedom of Information Act will be analyzed to include the Attorney General's opinions on the subject and their determinations of various problems that arise when dealing with FOIA relevant case law.

Course Objectives

Students of this class will gain an understanding of:

- The scope and limitation of the Act
- Various definitions that must be considered
- The duties imposed by the Act on Law Enforcement agencies
- Time deadlines provided by the Act
- Various exclusions from the coverage of the Act
- Various techniques in dealing with FOIA requests, to include "alternatives"
- Local Records Act to include "Local Records" defined
- Guidelines for compliance (both paper and electronic records)
- Required methods of identifying, inventorying and destroying local records
- **SB1304 Police Reform Bill (body camera)**

Mr. Don Hays is an Attorney at Law, and former Macoupin County (IL) State's Attorney. Don previously served with the Illinois Appellate Prosecutor's office for 30 years as a Staff Attorney and as Senior Staff Counsel. He was in charge of the Continuing Legal Education Division which includes continuing legal education for Illinois State's Attorneys and law enforcement officers.
