(50 ILCS 705/10.12) Illinois Compiled Statutes, pertaining to Narcotics Detection Canine Training: Sec. 10.12. Police dog training standards. Beginning July 1, 2012, all police dogs used by State and local law enforcement agencies for drug enforcement purposes pursuant to the Cannabis Control Act (720 ILCS 550/), the Illinois Controlled Substances Act (720 ILCS 570/), and the Methamphetamine Control and Community Protection Act (720 ILCS 646/) shall be trained by programs that meet the minimum certification requirements set by the Board.
