### Course Description

This one-day (6-hour) training session will provide an overview of the Illinois County Jail Standards highlighting recent changes. This training will provide useful information for reducing exposure to civil and criminal liability.

Additionally, the minimum standards monitored by the Illinois Department of Corrections Office of Jail and Detention Standards will be addressed.

### Instructor(s)

**Frederick Chinn** is the Jail Administrator and holds rank as Chief in the Jail Division of Crawford County Sheriff's Office. Chinn has over 29 years in the law enforcement field. He began his career at the Lawrence County Sheriff's Department as a Dispatcher and in 1998 he changed his path to the correction's side of law enforcement. In 2005, Chinn was hired as Chief of Police of a small town in Southern Illinois, St. Francisville. In December 2006, Chinn was hired by his current department in Robinson, IL and during his time he has worked as a Correctional Deputy, Court Security Deputy, Juvenile Officer, a Trainer/Field Training Officer, Internal Affairs, Defensive Tactics Instructor, Field Training Officer Supervisor and Taser Instructor. Chinn currently serves as President/Executive Board Member of the Illinois Juvenile Officers Association, sits on several Task Force Committees for topics in Mental Health, Juveniles and Pretrial. He is also a Certified Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) member.
