Course Description			
<p>K-12 School Districts, as well as SROs, community law enforcement officers, and mental health professionals, are increasingly involved in the assessment and management of people who engage in threatening and volatile behaviors. This two-day training will help participants to better understand the dynamics of targeted violence and to develop and enhance strategies for early identification, assessment, and intervention with concerning situations.</p>			
Course Objectives			
<p><i>Day One</i> will provide participants with a working understanding of issues related to targeted violence, implementing a multi-disciplinary and systematic approach to assessment and management of cases, conducting contextually based assessment of cases, developing integrated intervention and case management strategies, and understanding foundational legal and policy issues in conducting such practices in accordance with professional standards.</p> <p><i>Day Two</i> will incorporate the use of case studies and facilitated discussions regarding critical issues (facing threat assessment teams) to enhance each participant's ability to apply concepts discussed on Day One of the workshop.</p>
