### Course Description

School Resource Officers are required to take a 16-hour SRO Refresher course, every two years. This School Resource Officer Refresher course is intended for current SRO's whose certifications need to be updated, to prevent them from expiring.

### Course Objectives

- ✓ Active Threat Response

### Equipment Students Must Provide

- Laptop
- **Day 2 – Officers must bring their own lunch as they will be working through the lunch hour**
- The final day of this 2-day class will be devoted to the necessary Active Threat Response training utilizing force-on-force scenarios. This will require participants to provide protective equipment including a thick long-sleeve shirt or jacket, gloves, and safety glasses. Officers should also bring all duty belt gear, excluding all weapons (firearms, TASERS, OC Spray, knives, etc.).

### Instructor

This course is taught by instructors from the CAIR Team. The CAIR Team brings a multi-disciplinary approach to teaching with 13 instructors, including SROs, Detectives, Task Force Commanders, SWAT, ITOA Master Instructors, Social Workers and Clinicians. The CAIR Team ([www.cairteam.org](http://www.cairteam.org)) are the lead instructors for the ILETSB SRO Certification and Recertification courses. The team is lead by Danielle Butts, LSW, Founder/CEO of All Our Children's Advocacy Center (AOCAC). Danielle has been with AOCAC for 26 years. Danielle has been a law enforcement instructor for the past 19 years.
