Course Description			
<p><i>This training fills a void that has been present in basic police firearms training in Illinois for decades as the shotgun portions of Mandatory Firearms Training and Basic Law Enforcement Academy firearms training has merely covered “shotgun familiarization” lacking any real training of qualification standards.</i></p>			
<p>This course is designed to provide students with the basic skills, knowledge, and abilities necessary to deploy the Police Shotgun safely and effectively in a deadly force arrest situation. Although the shotgun has been adapted over the years to deliver “Less-Lethal” or “Non-Lethal” munitions, this course will focus strictly on the shotgun being used as a deadly force device. This course will focus on the benefits, capabilities, potential hazards, and limitations of the shotgun in the law enforcement environment.</p>			
Course Objectives			
<p>Describe the circumstances in which the Police Shotgun might be deployed. Safely handle the Police Shotgun, during both training and deployment. Demonstrate the proper carry technique (ready positions) during deployment. Demonstrate the basic shooting fundamentals with the Police Shotgun. Accurately shoot the Police Shotgun. Remedy weapon failure (malfunctions). Properly load, reload, and unload the Police Shotgun. Describe the proper carry condition – (magazine load, round chambered, manual safety engagement. Properly clean, lubricate, inspect, and maintain the Police Shotgun. Describe the characteristics and ballistic performance of the various types of lethal ammunition for the Police Shotgun. Describe the maximum practical effective range of the Police Shotgun with various types of lethal ammunition. Understand equipment and accessories (sights, lights, slings, extra ammunition supply, etc.) which may be added to the Police Shotgun.</p>
